SYNOD UPDATE

Our Diocesan Synod was held in London on May 28th – 30th. St. Augustine was represented by Rev. Paul (clergy) and Jane Crosby (lay), with Deacon Bill also attending as an observer. The "Popular Report" – a summary of the Synod proceedings – is printed and posted on the bulletin board and can also be accessed at:

During Synod we heard from our Bishop in her charge to Synod "**One Body, One Spirit – Live a life worthy of your calling!**" and from a number of speakers representing numerous ministries, committees and missions through the diocese detailing ways that the diocese is living the Five Marks of Mission. We heard about the work of PWRDF, The Justice League of Huron, our Youth, stewardship, visioning, ministry & mission plans; and participated in small group initial discussions concerning the proposed amendment to the marriage canon.

Each parish has been asked to draw up a Ministry and Mission plan setting out our goals to meet the Five Marks of Mission and include plans for building and financial sustainability for presentation at Vestry meetings next January.

In the Deanery this fall, there will be opportunities for us to continue the discussions around the marriage canon which is to come back to our Diocesan Synod in 2018. We will also be hearing more about "Fresh Expressions" of ministry; and in the parish, about Stewardship.
