Operation Point North

This year's Lenten Project is "Operation Point North" – a local Anglican initiative to support the Indigenous community at Kingfisher Lake. Kingfisher Lake is located 350 km (220 miles) north of Sioux Lookout. It is accessible by air (year round) and by "ice roads" for a few weeks in February depending on the weather. There are 411 people in the community, 160 of whom are children and teenagers.

Like many communities in the Canadian north, high transportation costs mean that many food items are either unavailable or incredibly expensive. Arrangements have been made with ground transport and pilots from the Windsor Flying Club to take badly needed supplies (food items, school supplies) to the community ... Anglican parishes in the Essex Deanery are coming together to fill these planes.

Here at St. Augustine we have taken responsibility for the "milk products" ... and our Lenten Offering will be contributed to the project.

How can we contribute?

- ❖ Purchase and donate one or more of these food items
 - Powdered milk
 - Infant formula
 - Canned milk
 - Coffee whiteners
 - Nesquik™
 - Powdered juices
- ❖ Make a cash donation – Lenten envelopes were included with a previous bulletin and additional envelopes are available at the display board in the church (*all money donated will be used to purchase supplies. Transportation costs, both trucking and air, have been donated by those providing the transport*).
