Rev'd Paul will be present here in the building until 6:00pm today (Good Friday) for anyone who would like to take the time for personal confession and to keep the doors unlocked for anyone who may like to journey through the Stations of the Cross.

Although the Anglican Church does not require private confession (because we confess as a community every time we gather for Eucharist), we do have a structure to facilitate personal, private confession and any member of the community can request it at any time.

Should you feel called to offer that type of confession today, please stop by any time as Rev'd Paul will be here for those who desire this sacrament.

In addition, a reflective experience of the **Stations of the Cross** have been set up around the church property today and will be in place for the rest of the day. These stations are set up for your own pace and timing. This may take you as little as 20 minutes or may take you all afternoon, it truly depends on your needs and prayers today.

Please pick up a "guidebook" at the front door and make your journey as you desire it. Rev'd Paul will be here until 6:00pm to offer support for anyone who may feel they need further conversation or reflection as you journey through the stations.
