ANNOUNCEMENTS

WELCOME! to all visitors and a special welcome to the 83rd Scouts – youth and leaders – and their families. It is our pleasure to have you worshipping with us again this morning.

LENTEN SERIES ON SUNDAY EVENINGS ... the time to walk together has come. Together, we are called to journey through Lent as an opportunity to reflect upon the wonder and the power, the brutality and the majesty, of Jesus' ministry, passion and resurrection. You are invited to participate in a six-week Lenten Series – a mix of movies and scriptural study sessions – beginning this evening. Come for 5:30pm to share a bowl of soup followed by the movie "Babette's Feast" at 6pm.

LENTEN OUTREACH PROJECT ... this year, the parish Lenten outreach project will focus upon support to CWF (Canadian World Education Foundation) – and in particular to the Learning Centre to be built in the small village of Boma Ng'ombe, Tanzania. **Solar panels** will be required to provide the needed electricity to run 20 computers, 20 light bulbs and a charging telephone. **St. Augustine's Lenten Goal** ... to raise the funds for the purchase of the solar panels ... approx. \$2,400 (or \$120 per computer/light bulb). Please see the display in the lobby, Lenten offering envelopes are provided with the bulletin this morning. A "light" will be lit on the model building for every \$120 raised ... *"let us walk in the light as he himself is in the light and we will have fellowship with others"* (1 John 1:7) this Lenten season.
