WELCOME TO ST. AUGUSTINE! We are delighted that you have chosen to join us this morning. If this is your first time with us, we wish you a warm welcome and hope that you will feel part of our parish family.

LENTEN OUTREACH PROJECT ... this year, the parish Lenten outreach project focuses upon support to CWF (Canadian World Education Foundation) – and the Learning Centre to be built in the small village of Boma Ng'ombe, Tanzania. **Solar panels** will be required to provide the needed electricity to run 20 computers, 20 light bulbs and a charging telephone. **St. Augustine's Lenten Goal** ... to raise the funds for the purchase of the solar panels ... approx. \$2,400 (or \$120 per computer/light bulb). Please see the display in the lobby (cheques payable to "St. Augustine"). A "light" will be lit on the model building for every \$120 raised ... *"let us walk in the light as he himself is in the light and we will have fellowship with others"* (1 John 1:7) this Lenten season.

LENTEN SERIES ON SUNDAY EVENINGS ... This week – scripture study on Sunday evening beginning at 6pm. "The Passion: According to the Evangelists (Mark & Matthew)".
